What is the GED Lab?

It's a PearsonVUE Authorized Testing Center where we proctor General Education Development (GED) exams located inside the Beale Memorial Library, Second Floor (701 Truxtun Avenue, Bakersfield 93301)

How do I make an Appointment to take the Exam at this site?

At <u>GED.com</u> - It is also the best place for all the questions and most up-to-date information available. You will pay for the test online with a debit or credit card when you schedule your test

What are the Dates & Times of the GED Lab?

Tuesdays from 11:00 AM - 4:00 PM

What are the Requirements for taking the Exam?

A candidate must be a resident of California; 18 years or older and out of High School; provide a legal government-issued ID with a photo & proof of residency

How many test subjects are there to pass and obtain a GED?

- 1. Reading Language Arts (155 minute max)
- 2. Mathematics (120 minute max)
- 3. Science (95 minute max)
- 4. Social Studies (75 minute max)

These can be taken in any order and at this location you can take a max of (2) test parts per day

How many opportunities do I have to pass the GED Test?

As many as it takes to pass. We've had people come back at least (6) times

How much does it cost to take or retake the GED Exam?

\$35.00 per test subject (\$140.00 total)
You will receive two discounted retakes for every
GED test subject you purchase but don't pass.
There is no waiting period for your first two
retakes. After taking a test subject (3) times, you
will have to wait (60) days each time before
retesting

Where do I take classes prior to being able to take the GED Exam here?

You don't have to take classes prior to testing, however instruction prior to testing is a benefit to test takers. The Bakersfield Adult School/Job Spot & Bakersfield College offers classes

Do I have to take the GED Ready practice test before testing?

No. The practice test is recommended but not required. The practice test can provide information about your readiness to test and offer guidance for further study

Are there any other places to schedule to take a GED Test other than here?

We only know of two other centers in Kern County: Bakersfield College and the Bakersfield Adult School

What is the set up of the GED Lab?

PearsonVUE has determined that a testing lab has to be set up with a distance of (4) feet between delivery stations/computers. Our lab is set up to be the least distractive as possible to the test takers and following current COVID guidelines
